

PM for using field experience to ensure quality education

Prime minister Tarique Rahman on Tuesday stressed the importance of incorporating experiences and recommendations from field-level officials into the formulation and implementation of education policies.

During his first visit to the Ministry of Education at the Bangladesh Secretariat after he assumed office, he said that ensuring quality education for all students remained one of the government's top priorities.
