

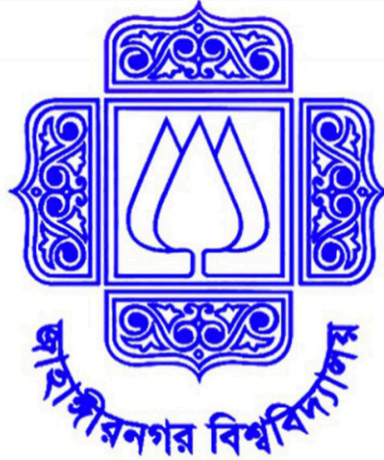
JU suspends 12 students over ragging allegations

History department students punished for harassing freshers

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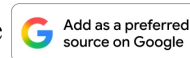

Jahangirnagar University has suspended 12 students of history department over allegations of ragging first-year students from the same department.

The decision was announced in a notice signed by JU acting registrar Dr ABM Azizur Rahman on Saturday night.

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All suspended students belong to the department's 2024-25 academic session.

According to the notice, the alleged ragging took place between 11:00pm on July 3 and 2:00am on July 4 at the Jahangirnagar University School and College playground.

The notice said several students from the History department's 54th batch (academic session 2024-25) summoned a group of first-year students from the department's 55th batch (academic session 2025-26) to the playground, where they verbally abused them, forced them to hold their ears, and harassed them under the pretext of teaching them "manners".

The notice further said that the Jahangirnagar University Students' Discipline Ordinance, 2018 prohibits all forms of teasing, ragging and abusive behaviour on campus. As the accused students were found to have violated the ordinance, the university suspended them.
